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THE POCKET PARK

A HIDDEN SPOT IN AN URBAN LANDSCAPE

n Fort Lauderdale, you have likely visited some of the City's larger parks: Holiday Park, Snyder Park and of course, Riverwalk. Then there's Downtown Fort Lauderdale's other signature parks including Stranahan Park and the JoAnn Smith Botanical Gardens, and Huizenga Park, which just broke ground on May 22 for its \$15 million transformation.

Our city also has much smaller parks tucked away in neighborhoods and in urban spaces. Also open to the public, these spaces meet similar needs to their larger, better-known cousins: they provide spots to relax and enjoy the outdoors.

These spaces are known as a "pocket park." Such a park is usually no larger than a quarter of an acre and is often in an urban setting, surrounded by commercial buildings, according to the National Recreation and Park Association (NRPA).

In fact, the Downtown Development Authority wrote its very own Pocket Park Playbook in 2023. It outlines the four hallmarks for a successful pocket park, according to NRPA:

- 1. A pocket park is accessible
- 2. It allows for people to engage in activities
- 3. It is a comfortable space with a good image

4. It is a sociable place where people can meet each other and take visitors

An ideal pocket park should have these qualities, according to the Pocket Park Playbook:

- Green space: sod or turf should cover at 50 percent of the space
- A rain garden: to tamp down heat from concrete
- Trees: once the foliage matures, the canopy should provide at least 40 percent coverage
- Shade structures: such structures may be used in place of trees
- Connectivity: Wi-Fi and solar electrical outlets should be available
- Parking: for handicapped spaces, rideshare accessibility and bikes
- Other elements: flexible space, seating, raised planters and landscaped beds

The DDA also outlined that a pocket park should have art elements.

"It is the intent of the pocket park system to act as a unified but rotating art exhibit," according to the Pocket Park Playbook. "The dynamic nature of this system should draw residents and visitors back to the spaces time and

time again to experience curated art that tells a story using each piece of the whole."

Explore your own neighborhood and give a pocket park a try.

A local example of a pocket park is Tranquility Park on Northeast 11th Avenue in Fort Lauderdale. The park is only one-tenth of an acre and is open from 6 a.m. to 9 p.m.

DISTRICT 4 HAPPENINGS

PARK REZONING, MOBILITY HUB AND PUBLIC SAFETY

ector Park and Virginia Shuman Park Rezoned and Protected

In April, the Commission and I approved four ordinances that rezoned City-owned properties so that they are designated as Parks, Recreation and Open Space



districts. The properties have been used and maintained as public park spaces and rezoning them in such a manner offers significant protection. Specific protections limit the use of the property to a typical park with open space for activities. These protections also restrain the ability to sell, transfer or lease the property for more than one year without a unanimous vote of the Commission.

Hector Park was previously zoned as Residential Single Family/Low Medium Density and Virginia Shuman was previously zoned as Residential Single. These

significant zoning changes protect our community parks for continued enjoyment for generations to come.

17th Street Mobility Hub Project

The Southeast/Southwest 17th Street Mobility Hub project includes the completion of sidewalks, implementation of traffic calming measures, the addition of raised and separated bike lanes and new crosswalks, among other improvements.

In collaboration with the Metropolitan Planning Organization and Broward County Transportation, I held



two town halls for District 4 and the wider community to help develop initial concepts. During the outreach process, a preferred alternative was chosen by consensus of the participants with full support from Croissant Park and Poinciana Park Civic Associations. The project was

approved by Commission and will be considered for Federal Transit Administrative grant funding this year. Design is expected to begin by the end of 2024 and last approximately 18 months, with construction to follow.

Public Safety, Improved Response Times and School Resource Officers

Public safety is one of my top priorities and during our district goal setting town hall, our neighbors made it clear that it is a prime concern. My colleagues and I approved a regional interlocal agreement between Fort Lauderdale Fire Rescue, the Broward County Sheriff's Office, and Broward County for cooperative fire, rescue, EMS and special operations response teams. The agreement allows for the closest available unit, regardless of agency affiliation, to respond to a life-threatening emergency and aid.

We also approved a three-year agreement with the School Board of Broward County for continuation of the school resource officer program. The program provides for Fort Lauderdale Police Department officers to serve full-time at nine Fort Lauderdale schools. Two officers will be assigned to each of these schools: William Dandy Middle, New River Middle, Sunrise Middle, Fort Lauderdale High, Sheridan Technical, Stranahan High, Seagull Alternative, Whiddon-Rogers Education Center, and Dillard Middle/High schools.

I am looking forward to our annual Eye of the Storm Hurricane expo at the Museum of Discovery and Science on June 1. I hope to see you there!

At this time, we are continuing with our district town halls. Please be on the lookout for more town hall announcements. I look forward to the collaboration between city staff and our district residents.

It is through continued collaboration and partnership that we can achieve great things in District 4 and I wholeheartedly look forward to continuing to work with you.

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



ast month the DDA celebrated the groundbreaking of Huizenga Park Reimagined. It was incredible to see so many community members excited to be part of this ceremonial milestone after years of thoughtful planning and design! On behalf of our team and board of directors, we thank the City of Fort Lauderdale, State of Florida, Specialty Restaurants Corporation, our generous donors, and our friends at Riverwalk for making this moment possible.

Our entire team is energized by the overwhelming enthusiasm for this project. We can't wait to build this incredible park and special gathering place for everyone, forever. Construction will kick off this summer and is expected to last until late 2025, when the park will reopen with more than a dozen unique outdoor rooms that will set the park apart from traditional public spaces.


Here is an inside look into a handful of the unique spaces that will transform Huizenga Park into Downtown Fort Lauderdale's iconic outdoor living room, dining room and backyard.

- The Huizenga Family Spirit of Fort Lauderdale Fountain will remain a defining feature for Huizenga Park. A timeless refresh will revitalize the fountain with new lighting and cascading jets. More shade and seating opportunities will be added around the fountain, creating a perfect respite from the bustle of the city.
- The Civic Lawn will emerge as Downtown Fort Lauderdale's central greenspace, a destination to enjoy community gatherings or to simply relax shaded by a lush shade canopy and the surrounding cityscape.
- We're excited to introduce Downtown's first dedicated space for our furry friends, The Towriss Family Dog Run. I look forward to seeing you there with your four-legged friends when the park reopens!
- Coming soon along the Riverwalk will be The Motwani River Terrace, a special seating area nestled along the edge of the New River. This terrace will be the perfect place to watch the nonstop parade of boats traverse our waterways.
- The AutoNation-sponsored Deck located alongside the Riverwalk will become a home for intimate performances and small gatherings. Imagine strolling along the Riverwalk with your friends over the weekend to be greeted by a violinist.
- Huizenga Park will also introduce a series of terraces that mirror European-style plazas. Both the Las Olas Legacy Terrace and Rielly Family Terrace will become perfect destinations to meet a friend, hold a quick meeting, or read a book under the lush shade canopy.
- With an 85% increase in kids living in Downtown since 2018, we're partnering with Joe DiMaggio Children's Hospital to create the Moundscape, a dedicated play area for children with a series of climbable play mounds that blend into the surrounding landscape.

With these improvements, I'm proud to share that the new park design will increase the park's programmable space by 350 percent, increase biodiversity by 250 percent with the addition of 58 new plant species, and generate a 216 percent increase in shade with the addition of more than 80 new trees. Huizenga Park will literally become the coolest outdoor space in the City!

There's something for everyone in the Reimagined Huizenga Park! I can't wait to reveal more as construction gets underway. (1)

A HIDDEN BEACH TREASURE

here are so many amazing things about living in Fort Lauderdale, sometimes we forget to look for hidden gems. But the hunt for these locations is something that I love most. This stems from when I was growing up in Massachusetts when we would go on Sunday drives and my father would ask "Left or right?" at the end our street and the adventure to find hidden gems would begin! It would be a great adventure to find new places, new lunch stops, new parks and just the experience of the journey.

My husband and I carry on the tradition of small local adventures on weekends but with today's world we often use the power of Google to do some research ahead. And it is no longer just about the road less traveled but still about new restaurants and parks to find that we never knew

about. There are so many treasures here in South Florida!

One hidden gem is the area on the beach tucked into the corner of State Route A1A and Sunrise Boulevard centered around Sunrise Lane. The area can often be forgotten but has so much to offer. Vice Mayor Steve Glassman advocated for the City Commission to allocate funding to be included in the City's budget last year to work on a project to enhance the streetscape areas of this district in an effort to help make this hidden gem sparkle. "I think of this little corner of our beach as our own Greenwich Village," Glassman said. "It's got charm, a bit funky, and only needs a little TLC to really shine."

The project just completed the concept development phase which included a series of three public meetings to

create a vision for what this area could be in the future. The well attended meetings were hosted by the vice mayor who is the District 2 commissioner and brought a group of stakeholders together of business owners, property owners and residents together to create the vision.

The first meeting focused on what was perceived as the issues and what the expectations of the future district are. The second meeting provided three alternatives to try to address the issues identified and reach that vision. Feedback was received on each, and the third meeting was to provide the final recommended preferred alternative.

Although the most transformative concept was the most highly received, that alternative was not without asterisks that would require additional work before they could be accomplished and a significant amount of funding. Because the main intent is to get something done sooner rather than later, a phased approach was selected: the project will start smaller and be able to enhance the foundation of that project in the future if funding is identified and the challenges are overcome.

The key elements that will be addressed include improved lighting, additional room for sidewalks, gateway features, improved pedestrian crossings, and efforts to add art to the district with the potential installation of a mural on the back of the Sonesta Hotel.

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

CARRYING ON A FAMILY LEGACY

ucked away along a tree-lined stretch of Surf Road is a worthwhile destination overlooked by many. Surrounded by Hollywood North Beach Park and with the Atlantic Ocean as its backyard, the historic Carpenter House isn't usually at the top of visitors' must-see lists. Even most locals don't know about it unless they happen to visit as part of a school field trip.

But it's a hidden gem worth discovering.

Built in 1941 by local resident Hank Carpenter, the family lived in the home until the death of Mrs. Carpenter in 2001. Broward County bought the home and land in 2004 from the Carpenter family trust and preserved both the land and buildings per the family's wishes.

Today, Broward County partners with Nova Southeastern University to run the NSU Marine Education Center on the grounds. The Center officially opened in 2017.

The original Carpenter family home and outbuildings were renovated to accommodate an education center, with careful attention paid to preserving as much of the original architecture as possible, including the original circa 1941 kitchen. Another standout feature is the custom-made iron stair rails that feature an inlaid fish motif reflecting the Carpenter family's love of nature and the sea.

Today, the family's former beach cabana is an exhibit hall where visitors can learn about south Florida's unique ecosystem through a variety of interactive displays. The main house's family room has been converted to a large meeting space, and the bright sunroom is lined with aquariums that are home to a variety of smaller turtles given to the center over the years. But the stars of the show are found in the family's spacious saltwater swimming pool, retrofitted with stateof-the-art filtration and pump systems to mimic natural ocean conditions.

Captain, a 17-year-old green sea turtle, is one of these residents. She suffered a significant shell injury in 2010. The way the injury healed caused micro bubbles to become trapped in the shell, destroying her natural buoyancy. As a result, Captain can't dive to harvest sea grass, an essential source of food for a wild turtle. This made her nonreleasable back into the wild.

Captain shares her home with Coral, another injured sea turtle who was discovered with significant injuries. Coral's injuries caused her to lose her right flipper and eye. Together, Captain and Coral are an integral part of the education efforts at the Marine Education Center. Visitors can also view daily public feeding sessions at 3:30 p.m.

Beyond turtles, the Marine Education Center also offers a variety of learning programs on diverse topics ranging from beach ecology and cephalopods to sustainability and invasive threats like the lionfish. There are also three habitat exhibits where visitors can learn about south Florida's natural environments of mangroves, sea grass, and coral reefs.

The Marine Industries Association of South Florida proudly partners with NSU through the Marine Research Hub to support similar programs that focus on oceanic preservation. Together we can achieve great things to help preserve and protect our ocean and its inhabitants. It all starts with education.









PRELIMINARY 2024 PROPERTY VALUES

A GUIDE TO TAXABLE VALUES

2024 Estimate of Taxable Values

The preliminary 2024 property values are now showing on our website at web.bcpa.net. Florida Statutes require our office use Jan. 1 as the date of assessment each year. Our office must consider changes in market conditions - up or down - when developing the Just/Market Values each year. The 2024 Just Values are based on the market data from Jan. 1, 2024, back through Jan. 2, 2023, with Jan. 1, 2024, as the date of assessment. If you purchased your property in 2024, your 2024 purchase price along with comparable market data from 2024 will be used in setting your property's 2025 Just/Market Value. Our office will mail the 2024 TRIM (proposed tax) Notices to all Broward property owners in mid-August. This notice will show your property's 2024 Just Value, Assessed/Save Our Homes Value, all tax-saving exemptions you are receiving, and the proposed tax rates as set by the various taxing authorities listed on the notice.

Quarterly Tax Payment Installment Plan

While the Property Appraiser's Office does not set or collect taxes, our office receives many calls from residents inquiring about installment tax bills and their recently approved exemptions. Broward County's Records, Taxes and Treasury Division is responsible for the billing and collecting of property taxes.

For property owners on the 2024 installment payment plan, the first two installment payments (June 2024 and September 2024) are based on the previous (2023) tax year. This means residents who have been approved for 2024 Homestead Exemption or other exemptions will not see these 2024 exemptions on either the June or September installment bills. The final two installment bills (December 2024 and March 2025) will be adjusted to include any 2024 exemptions or changes to the property's taxable value. The deadline to apply for Broward County's Installment Payment Plan was May 1, 2024. 
